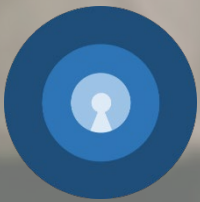

ASSET IDENTIFICATION

The first step in our risk assessments is identifying your organization's assets that may be susceptible to security threats. Assets can include not only your material possessions, but also your people, data, and reputation.

RISK IDENTIFICATION

We then undertake a data review process to identify risks that pose a realistic threat to your organization.

VULNERABILITY ASSESSMENT

Current protective measures are analyzed to determine if they adequately protect the identified assets from the identified threats.

PROBABILITY & IMPACT ANALYSIS

The potential for an identified threat(s) to impact your organization, and the impact to the organization if this were to occur is quantified.

MITIGATION

Based on our findings we recommend cost effective solutions tailored to your institution's needs.

These solutions may consist of electronic security systems, staff training, policies and procedures, or in extreme situations Security staffing. When we are involved early in the facility design process we can often recommend Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) elements that can be built into the facility's design that will reduce exposure to crime risk while incurring no or minimal additional expense.
